

## Affordable Care Act Preventive Items

January 1, 2020

In accordance with requirements put forth through the Affordable Care Act (ACA), applicable employers elect to provide evidence-based Preventive Drug coverage at \$0. Below is the list of medications available for the ACA Standard Preventive Drug List.

The following list of preventive medications should be used as a guide. It cannot be considered a comprehensive listing of medications available or covered without a cost-sharing. This list includes classes that are covered under the ACA preventative list but is not inclusive of all drugs within a class. Coverage of any of the listed medications (including over-the-counter (OTC) medications) requires a prescription from a licensed health care provider. The availability or coverage of these medications without cost-sharing may be subject to criteria established by the terms of your benefit plan. Contraceptives may not be included under some plans.

This list will be reviewed periodically and is subject to change, as ACA guidelines are updated and formulary changes are made.

<b>Aspirin</b> – Over-the-counter (OTC)	81 mg and 325 mg For members 10-75 years with high cardiovascular risk  To prevent cardiovascular disease and colorectal cancer and for pregnant members who are high-risk for preeclampsia.
<b>Fluoride</b>	0.25 mg and 0.5 mg drops and tablets  Children ages 6 months to 5 years
<b>Folic acid</b> – over-the-counter(OTC)	0.4 mg and 0.8 mg  For members who may become pregnant
<b>Vitamin D</b> – over-the-counter (OTC)	1,000 IU or less  Adults age 65 or older

<p><b>Over-the-counter smoking-cessation drugs:</b> Nicotine gum Nicotine lozenge Nicotine patch</p>	<p>Adults age 18 or older  Quantity limits may apply</p>
<p><b>Smoking-cessation drugs:</b> Bupropion (<i>generic Zyban</i>®) Chantix®</p>	<p>Adults age 18 or older  Quantity limits may apply</p>
<p><b>Breast cancer preventive drugs:</b> tamoxifen raloxifene</p>	<p>Adults ages 35 and older at increased risk for breast cancer  Generic only  Quantity limits may apply</p>
<p><b>Bowel preparation medications for colonoscopy screening of colorectal cancer:</b> polyethylene glycol 3350 products bisacodyl magnesium citrate magnesium hydroxide Sodium phosphate laxative</p>	<p>OTC and prescription products  ONE bowel preparation regimen per year with \$0 copay  For members age 50 to 75 years</p>
<p><b>Statin Medications</b> lovastatin – all strengths atorvastatin 10 mg, 20 mg simvastatin 5 mg, 10mg, 20mg, 40mg</p>	<p>Generic only  For members between 40 to 75 years at high risk  Quantity limits may apply</p>
<p><b>Vaccinations</b> Hepatitis A and B Varicella Zoster (Shingles) Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis Meningococcal Influenza Pneumococcal (Pneumonia) Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Poliovirus Measles, Mumps, Rubella</p>	<p>Vaccine specific age limits may apply.  Quantity limits may apply.</p>
